Empirical Labs EL8 Distressor £249

It's no exaggeration to say that Empirical Labs' Distressor is one of the most coveted compressors of all time. The clue is in the name: this isn't a traditional dynamics processor but instead one ready to impart a rich and highly flexible character onto any input signal you dare to send its way. What makes Distressor unique? For a start, it's capable of a super-fast response time, allowing it to decimate transient peaks and almost 'reimagine' sounds. The Ratio options include 'Nuke'; the Distressor's unique take on limiting, which has warm, rich, inflating sonic qualities. But most of all, it's the colour and rich tonal shaping added as a consequence of processing signals through Distressor which have made it a studio favourite. Expect this one to be a huge hit.

Brainworx have quickly established themselves as UAD's go-to provider of modelled amplifiers, and within 9.4, there's a powerful and dedicated bass amp added to a growing portfolio. The amp is question is one favoured by luminaries including Radiohead and is a model of the Gallien-Krueger 800RB. Whilst this plugin will cause most excitement amongst electric bass players, there's masses here for those looking to inflate synth basses too. The power and rasp is particularly impressive, all the more so when you engage the onboard four-band EQ and instantiate Brainworx's flexible FX rack. Two onboard power amps further add to the bespoke nature of what's possible and further enhance Brainworx's reputation as an important UAD partner. www.uaudio.com

For those lucky enough to do so, the very best of the microphone collection from one of the world's best know recording studios becomes available, with models of classic Neumann, AKG, RCA and Sony microphones available. The modelling technology here is absolutely breathtaking but, for now, will remain relatively niche unless you're prepared to make the hardware investment to match the software capability. www.uaudio.com

Dytronics Tri-Stereo Chorus

The Tri-Stereo Chorus is the second Dytronics plugin Softube have developed for UAD. Rich, creamy, analogue chorus is the order of the day here – the sound of the original hardware became synonymous with lush Rhodes pianos. However, it soon found favour with guitarists, synth players and mix engineers the world over, thanks to it featuring three independent bucket-brigade delay channels labelled Left, Centre and Right. Each of these is modulated by a sweeping LFO before being blended with as much of the original input signal as you want. Better still, each channel has its own controls for feedback and delay response, offering yet more flexibility. One neat trick is that whilst the LFO Mode can be set to Manual or Preset (fixed speed), you can engage both simultaneously for some great cross-modulation doubling treatments. www.uaudio.com
