KHDK says the No.1 Overdrive pedal provides similar sounds to an overdriven valve amp and has cascading gain stages. The Gain and Volume knobs work as you'd expect them to, but there's also a Bass knob that controls the bottom-end, and that acts as a secondary gain control to increase lower mid-frequency gain.

The pedal has two modes. Lo mode has the lower gained settings and can run from a cleanish boost, through edge-of-breakup sounds, to a nice crunchy drive that works well for Keef-style rhythm chops. Hi delivers a fatter, more saturated sound with plenty of sustain, not unlike the sound of later-generation Marshall amps. That fatness and gain increases nicely with the Bass knob, but not so much to muddy the sound, while the Treble knob fully clockwise lets all the high frequency through, but rolls back to mellow the sound: a useful asset when matching it to your amp. **[TC]**

The No.2 Clean Boost is visually the reverse mirror image of the No.1: the black and white colours have been swapped around; the control setup remains the same. What you have here, though, is much less gain from the pedal's starting point and a slightly warmer midrange voicing.

In Lo mode with Volume up, you can get various levels of clean boost with or without tonal shift by setting the Gain knob from about 10 o'clock and beyond. The Bass knob works in combination with the Gain knob here in adding some extra gain. Careful juxtapositions of the two can dial in plenty of subtle variations, adding a little edge and some grittiness to a clean amp. Hi mode takes us to the next stage of true overdrive and is roughly on a par with the Lo mode on the No.1 Overdrive, in that it can deliver a similar range of sounds in the breakup and raunch areas. **[TC]**

A germanium fuzz pedal with perfectly appropriate purple chickenhead knobs, the Scuzz Box has a toggle-switched buffer designed to increase placement options in your effects chain and combat tone-sucking from long cable runs – something we take advantage of, finding it adds clarity and reduces top-end loss.

At lower Fuzz knob levels, there are some cool overdrive sounds with a fuzzy edge, but higher up this is proper gooey vintage fuzziness with great playability, responding well to dynamics, cleaning up nicely with guitar volume, and retaining a useful mush-free articulation when playing chords. There's plenty of variation available from the Deep knob, adjusting low-end before the gain stage from lean to fat, and the Tone knob, which sets the top-end. Scuzz mode offers that sputtering gated fuzz, which can be cool, as long as you adjust your playing to avoid false triggering. **[TC]**
